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
















Leaving Anyone Behind is a matter of the utmost importance

Altogether with many actors that believe in the potential of football to deliver social transformation, **A Ganar** emerged as one of the first efforts in Ecuador combining football, youths and development

Today, after 18 years, our country and the entire world are facing new challenges that impel us to continue proposing strategies and actions, which must include everyone. The potential of football to foster inclusion and empowerment

From FIFA and CONMEBOL, the commitment to the 17 SDGs and the 2030 Agenda is more visible with the recent adherence to UN initiative Global Goals.

Sport and football makes us work and sets us goals and objectives to meet. There are private foundations and institutions that have been recognized for their work, for example, with amputees, young mothers, children in situations of domestic violence, drug addictions, among others. Football has the potential to bring solutions to these challenges.

Through various tools it is possible for vulnerable people to integrate into society, have an orderly disciplined life, take care of their health and their integrity.

I have the honor of being the representative of South America on the FIFA council. Inclusion and equity are objectives that CONMEBOL has been pursuing with a view to strengthening women's football and female empowerment. There are three pillars focused on developing skills, strengthening talent and building loyalty. 1. For whom FUDELA works

It is estimated that more than 1.8 billion people are between the ages of 10 and 24, which represents the largest generation of young people in history who will soon be facing the consequences of not making quick decisions.

Young people are the key to a sustainable future as they are capable of generating key changes that allow the achievement of the SDGs to improve the lives of people and the health of the planet. On the contrary, lack of productive spaces creates a socio-affective vacuum that leads to risk situations such as premature pregnancies, alcoholism, suicides and exposure to risk factors. such as drug trafficking and gangs. Youths in Ecuador are at the moment in high risk of exclusion and vulnerability

Human mobility situation: Effects of forced displacement also at the local level with people looking for opportunities in cities

Education: School desertion and devaluation of essential lifeskills in particular in countries from the Global South

Mental Health: In Ecuador, an increasing number of people face obesity and mental health issues such as stress or depression (La Hora 2022).

Multidimensional violence: with a worrying normalization of violence against women with normalization of situations such as machismo and lack of opportunities.



2. Integral model Football for Development

Concept: Triangle of Change

Triangulation in football is one of the most effective mechanisms for building plays and is based on the collaborative work of several players. It opens spaces and generates movements that allow a team to achieve a change of perspective in relation to its current location.

Achieving a triangulation cannot be done in an isolated and static way. From a triangulation, other virtuous triangles are formed that allow the team to advance in the match. Human development is a key principle





1. People

During the pandemic, FUDELA became a benchmark for other local and regional NGOs, in the ability to adapt virtual resources without losing the essence of football (FUDELA Play). Similar outcomes occurred in the development of innovative methodologies which permitted a safe return to on site activities with biosafety standards.

To facilitate learning, new arrival mechanisms were seen, including the creation of a virtual learning environment FUDELA Academy, spaces with mentors, webinars, among others.



The work with vulnerable Ecuadorian youth and human mobility was highlighted if the incessant flow of young people from Venezuela and the marginal conditions of various areas of the country.

6 core values

Respect, communication, teamwork, discipline, self development and leadership

As key results, living conditions of children and adolescents and their families have been favorably improved through the prevention of risk situations. In addition, the recovery of the vision of the future, self-esteem and emotional support of different groups of boys, girls and adolescents and their families were also impacted through empowerment and capacity building, livelihoods (employment / productive insertion) and leadership, applying methodologies such as the use of social football, replication of activities, social plans.

A very important issue to overcome was aggressiveness. FUDELA's work contributed to prevent this negative factor and supported not only the youth but also the families to improve their mental well-being. The construction of recreation spaces and the good use of time were important results that were complemented by the reinforcement of life skills and universal rights.

Thanks to football, now the participants have a higher level of employability with assimilated tools and knowledge. Likewise, facilitators and participants reflect on their own attitudes (and behaviors) and can adapt their attitudes (and behaviors).

In response to the scarcity of educational and employment opportunities, many young people received educational alternatives in soft skills, technical training, employability, as part of the livelihood model of FUDELA A Ganar.

Creation of opportunities was an urgent need as a result of the loss of productive spaces during pandemic. As part of FUDELA's community intervention strategy, several partnerships with companies and other educational institutions were an important engine in the generation of productive insertion and the creation of new capacities. FUDELA ventured into the organization of sporting events such as CSR services for companies. This strategy allowed, participants of A Ganar and other young leaders of FUDELA to get other types of tools aimed at selfemployment. which included mentoring spaces and delivery of seed capital.

2. Communities

Interestingly, new capacities (knowledge and resources) were installed for facilitators, young leaders with direct effects on their groups and with the promotion of gender equality as a fundamental premise. Along these same lines, FUDELA developed intensive programs such as Active Minds Active Futures (Mental Health) and a German Certification in football base and for development

Another outstanding activity was the transfer process of the German football methodology that targeted young leaders and other coaches involved in grassroots soccer. The group of coaches received innovative skills to overcome the pandemic.

With the use of social distancing (Football in Corona) plus all biosafety measures and protocols, it was possible to implement training in communities and strengthen the employability of coaches and young leaders.

In the same line of employability and in a complementary manner, it is relevant to mention that the A Ganar program includes a certification process to train trainers in new methodologies that include work in a pandemic and tools to structure projects. This set of activities was implemented with the support of the German Government and streetfootballworld and made it possible to strengthen the structure of grassroots football in the country.

3. Advocacy

The articulation of actions was sought with local public and private actors at the level of incidence, especially those related to soccer and sports, to improve the opportunities of access to rights and inclusion of adolescents, young people of the population of interest and local, through processes of incidence. awareness. systematization and innovation. To mention some of them: Ecuadorian National Federation, IDV, Women's Super League, Directv, CHUBB, among others. These are efforts linked in addition to the fulfillment of the SDGs. in the framework of the 2030 Agenda.



Advocacy is a determining component in the interventions managed by FUDELA since it allows the involvement of new partners in the project and allows the dissemination of the different activities.



Several awareness-raising spaces were organized with the aim of connecting the universal power of football to social needs. The participation of local and international football figures, individuals and organizations was highly relevant. These events also fostered cooperation with other local actors at the local and international levels



As part of its advocacy purposes, FUDELA maintains its leadership role with the transmission of the unique radio program Deporte para el Desarrollo thanks to the association with one of the FM stations with the largest audience in Ecuador, 102.1 FM. Football is approached transversally. At the end of July 2020, a delegate from the FIFA Foundation participated in this space with the possibility of disseminating the different efforts that are being dedicated worldwide.

cooperation with Directy ln audiovisual capsules were launched with the aim of promoting equal opportunities access to and empowerment. Also in female football, special emphasis was placed on values related to Gender Equality (SDG 5). FUDELA developed a complete handbook and participated in SOMOS Equidad, the most inclusive collective project that has been developed in Latin America

FUDELA also promoted discussions with industry's decision makers as was the case of "Encuentro Fútbol por la Paz". Other important milestone was the cooperation with Ecuador's National Assembly.

FUDELA's work had an impact on the FIFA website, highlighting the role of our organization during COVID 19 and the different alternatives that we are implementing to continue spreading the universal power of football. One of the key actions was the crowfunding campaign **Nos Jugamos El Futuro**

Effective integration and values for life

Just one hundred meters and a narrow bridge separates Ecuador and Colombia. Endless mountains and a warm climate reflect the beauty and diversity of this area.

Emotions are breathed in a handful of attendees who have gathered at the Chical field. It is not Carlos Gruezo or Gigi Moriera who in a few minutes will jump onto this field of wooden goals and where there is only one rule: that everyone can play. Today is the turn of young people from **Ecuadorian and Colombian communities such as Tallambí and La Guaña**

This match symbolizes the union between two countries and all the vitality and passion that characterizes young people. From very early on, boys and girls from both borders arrived with the illusion of finding themselves in the eyes of other mates

Some, like Amalia Guiz from San Marcos Community, had to walk more than 5 hours. This young woman is part of the. Although she is passionate about soccer, her life is different from that of other young people since her main mission is to work in the field to help her family.

Through FUDELA's processes youths from these towns have new life plans for their future, as in the case of Amalia, who is about to finish her high school. Changes are noticeable in the expressions on their faces and the way they communicate. Now they see a future of great challenges but without losing their role in their community

19-year-old Steven conducts the game. He is one of the leaders in the area although until not long ago he was part of **FUDELA's Community Champions**. Now his mission is to keep youths away from various risk situations that abound in this area.











Football has allowed them to strengthen their soft skills through integration spaces such as this binational matches. Other smaller ones like Marlon from "La Esperanza" and his cousins look forward to the game from the edge of the field, imagining the moment when they can play.



My mind felt that it was me who was playing and running listening to the voices of my friends cheering us on. I had in my stomach a desire to call them "my team".

Esmeraldas, the "green" province of Ecuador is recognized for its beautiful beaches and for being the cradle of excellent soccer players. Also for being the most unequal area with high levels of marginality and exclusion. Football is helping to prevent risk situations such as drug consumption and different forms of violence.

Next to the court of this town of less than 700 people, you can see the statue of the Italian educator Leonardo Murialdo who gives the name to the team of Ashley and Elvia, two girls from the Kichwa community



They participate in the Goals for Life and Dreams tournament. Their smiles are big and crystal clear like the Bueno River that runs serene and happy a few meters from their homes.

Altogether with Naveli, their "values coach", also Kichw, they travel a few kilometers every Saturday their weekly play game. Values such as respect and teamwork are reinforced in eachmatch. Beyond the result the tournament is a great occasion to share, enjoy and learn that men and women have the same rights and opportunities

Since 2019, within the framework of the FIFA Foundation Community Program and with the support of the state oil company FUDELA, it has been implementing inclusive mixed tournaments in more than 6 provinces and 17 communities throughout Ecuador, also leaving other installed capacities that boost family economies, of the zones.

These tournaments are innovative since they incorporate a mixed and inclusive modality with which men, women, people in human mobility and with disabilities play in equal conditions under the supervision of value coaches who fulfill a training mission.



The application of football methodologies for development helps to prevent the violence that is common in this and other areas of Ecuador, with notorious impacts on the way boys and girls relate to each other.

Promoting mental health and other principles

COVID19 brought severe effects in the mental health dimension of vouths: depression due to school dropout or human loss, reduced social skills, physical inactivity, obesity, generalized increased alcohol stress. consumption, etc. Aggressiveness is another issue to address. Before the pandemic, violence on different levels (including sexism) was already present in many homes.

The "Active Minds" project uses the power of sport (football, baseball and table tennis), to strengthen mental health, a state of well-being in which the individual realizes his own potential, can face the factors stressful, enjoying life and being able to contribute to one's community. This project is aimed at +250 youths (from 12 to 17 years old) in 4 regions of Ecuador, with a special focus on women and groups in human mobility (refugees)

Sport festivals were held in the provinces of Carchi, Esmeraldas, Imbabura, Pichincha and Sucumbios, with more than 500 participants in total. These activities contributed to the strengthening of values such as resilience, empathy, self-control and emotions. management of providina spaces for healthy recreation and promoting the good use of free time.



Methodological transfers have been made upon the application of leisuresports activities and tools with the focus on reinforcing and promoting mental health. These workshops consisted of working with a national team of 30 learning facilitators or mediators who met once a month to talk about a specific social-emotional skill. These skills are correlated gradually, beginning with the "Management of Emotions and Feelings" reaching until the "Interpersonal Relations".

The Campaign

As an institutional response to the multiple effects generated by COVID 19, FUDELA, altogether with several institutions and personalities, carried out an awareness and fundraising campaign called "We Play For Our Future". Main goal was to raise USD 15,000 dollars to provide food and cleaning supplies to 1,000 families in 9 provinces of the country.

The campaign had the support of Ecuadorian sports figures such as Carlos Tenorio, Luis Fernando Saritama, Juan Carlos Burbano, among others. 1. New challenges

With just 7 years ahead of 2030 which supposes the fulfillment of the 17 SDGs. **FUDFLA** renovates commitment in the accomplishment of Agenda 2030

This vision goes beyond Education as we are already envisioning efforts towards 2050 with the new challenges that will shape society relationships and Earth's sustainability.

As a step forward in education programs livelihoods suppose an additional challenge as the lack of opportunities is one of the reasons for exclusion and risk environment

2. Targets and priorities

FUDELA has still much to contribute of the pioneering one organizations in the management of football as a tool for transformation. We know better than anyone the value of this game for the prevention, protection and creation of opportunities in of groups adolescents and youths who are increasingly exposed to risk factors such as drug use.

Based in our "Triangle for Change" model and its underpinning M&E system, FUDELA seeks to sustain its commitments towards disadvantaged youths.

3. Football Development Fund

An additional challenge is related to financial sustainability. Towards 2030 and beyond, FUDELA will adapt the traditional model that relies in funds comina from international cooperation. Although the role of current donors is determinant in our capacity to attend our populations of interest, a new investment fund will enhance

4. Leaving No One Behind depends in the capacity to create collaborative partnerships

We are willing to initiate a space for articulation with new international players sharing our same commitment and values. Sustainability continues to establish itself as an effective source of value creation and with greater roots in the business model of companies and networks.

The approach implies substantial commitments in the social, environmental and economic dimensions, with traceable impact indicators for its main stakeholders.



Projecting actions in macro areas such as peace building, poverty reduction or protection of the planet, supposes that individuals achieve true well-being at the level of their physical but also mental health is possible in the extent that true collaborative partnerships happen



4. Concluding remarks

With a huge range of experiences over the last 4 years, this section presents a set of recommendations to practitioners, individuals and organizations, that are keen to use football as a vehicle of change.

- A comprehensive strategy is needed to effectively respond to the situations described along this. SDGs, adaptation to local realities and focus on human development and soft skills, are mandatory aspects to cover.
- Need to adjust the mechanisms of arrival to the participants, facing the different processes with more participatory spaces that link other people in the family and community circle
- Reinvention and adaptation of methodologies to carry out virtual, semi-face-to-face and face-to-face processes, according to the reality of the different locations.
- Technology has played a decisive role in reaching youths people with an adequate use of free time and recreation.
- Delay in the delivery of funds and difficulty in securing other types of counterparts required for the sustainability of the project is a serious aspect
- Promote cooperation mechanisms with other local actors at the local and international level, and in the public, private and civil society is key to secure financial sustainability
- It is also key to continue exploring alternatives that measure and make visible the intangible impact that mental health work generates, with a preventive approach and, at the same time, with enormous potential as a generator of value for the different stakeholders.
